gave birth to a beautiful baby boy - Joey Etheridge, weighing 8lbs 9oz! Huge congratulations to her and Mr Etheridge!




These sessions are an opportunity to discuss issues or concerns you may have which are impacting your child in school or at home and plan some strategies that may help them to move forward.

Our science learning has led to further investigation - into the properties of materials. We look forward to finding out more about the life of soldiers and the wider community in WW1.


