







Safer Internet Day


This week has seen the arrival of some amazing take home tasks and we cannot wait to see more as they arrive over the coming week.

Here at Bedford Mencap we have been getting ready for summer playscheme 2022! We have been working to try and make the booking process easier for everyone, and therefore this is all done online now via the link below:

A bit about our scheme:

At Bedford Mencap Playscheme we support children & young people between the ages of 4 and 18yrs with Special Educational Needs & Disabilities (SEND) and we have a large number of experienced staff to support.

The dates are as follows, you can book 1, 2 or all of the dates (however many you want). Our bookings are taken on a first come, first served basis, so be quick!

Week 1: July; 25th (half day-PM, 12.30 start), 26th 27th, 28th, 29th

Week 2: August; 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th,

Week 3: August; 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, (half day-AM, finish 12.30).

Each group has a group leader, and support staff, all of whom have vast experience in working with children with special needs. To help with the ratio of adults-children, and support the children, we recruit volunteers, who are often young people aged 14yrs+ from local schools. If your child has not attended our scheme before or you want to discuss their needs further, please don't hesitate to phone or email me, so we can discuss ways to support your child effectively (details on the booking link).


The playscheme this year, will be held at **Westfield Primary School, Chester Road, Bedford, MK40 4HW** and will operate from 9.15am – 3.30pm.
